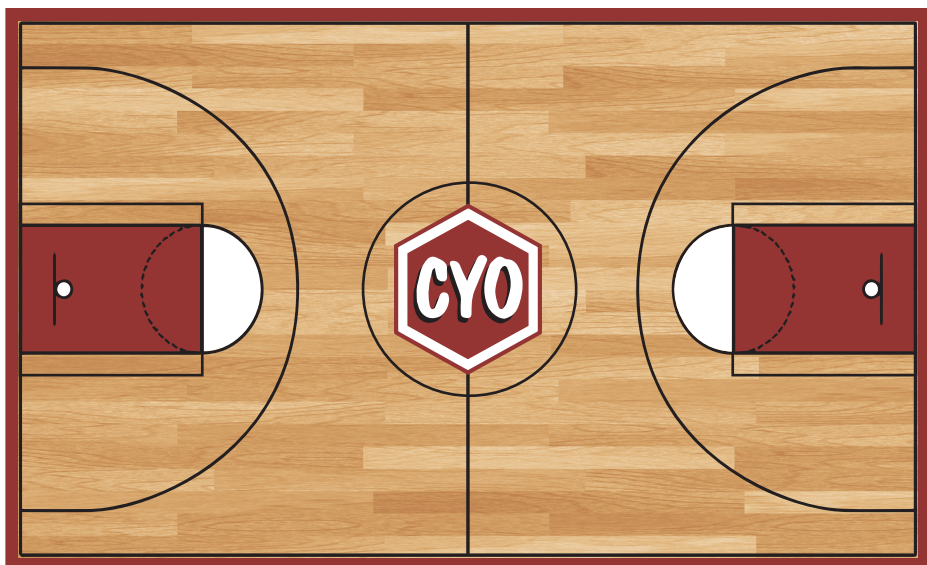

CYO Basketball – 66 YEARS!

The Mercer County CYO, one of the greatest and probably the longest running youth basketball leagues in the State, celebrated its 64th Anniversary during the 2015-2017 basketball season.

The league that started in 1952 at Junior High School #2 on South Olden Avenue in Trenton has come a long way to many different gymnasiums across Mercer County. The majority of the games are now played at the CYO Center at 920 South Broad Street in Trenton. The former movie theater hosts close to 400 games per year and has been called by many as the best school/ recreational gymnasium in Mercer County. This statement can be made since some major renovations to the gymnasium have taken place, most notably the restoration of the gym floor and the yearly touch up. It is a true first class facility that can serve more than grammar school basketball, proving this by hosting high school, college, and even professional basketball over the years. The gymnasium that hosts the majority of the games is part of the tradition and allure of CYO Basketball.

CYO Basketball is as strong as ever in Mercer County, with over 50 teams still competing in six different divisions in recent years. There are about 12 different schools/ parishes that participate in the CYO Basketball League and even the recent restructuring of the Diocesan grammar schools could not diminish the league. Many parishes now enter multiple teams to give more kids an opportunity to play. The CYO has been the main feeder system for the high schools in Mercer County and has produced countless talented basketball players that have gone on to star in upper level leagues. If the walls of the “John Mincey Manczak Memorial Gymnasium” at 920 South Broad Street could talk, they would tell quite a story. Mincey was one of the original CYO basketball referees and was still active at age 80 as a scorekeeper until his passing in October 1996.

It's hard to imagine the number of players who participated in CYO basketball over the years, and the number of games played. It is the teams, players, the countless volunteer coaches and the history that makes the Mercer County CYO rich in tradition. We will continue to see new generations of families coming to CYO Basketball games with their grandchildren talking about their days in the CYO. The tradition will continue and the CYO Basketball League will continue to be among the best in New Jersey and the country.

HISTORY OF THE MERCER COUNTY CYO

In September 1952, the Catholic Youth Organization of the Diocese of Trenton was established in all eight Counties of the Diocese, under the supervision of the late Father Leonard R. Toomey, Diocesan CYO Director.

Like its counterparts, the Mercer County CYO functioned in 26 parishes offering a four-fold program of spiritual, athletic, cultural, and social activities to boys and girls of both grammar school and high school age, as well as to young adults out of school and working. The latter group was known as CYAC's – Catholic Young Adult Club. With 3,000 youth in these three divisions participating weekly in the CYO program, the Mercer County CYO was one of the largest youth service agencies in the area.

On February 3, 1958, the Mercer County CYO opened its first official headquarters at 1 Centre Street, Trenton adjacent to Sacred Heart Church. The building was well known City-wide as the home of the former Men's Catholic Club and its gymnasium, game activity, and meeting rooms became alive again.

The CYO Day Camp began on July 7, 1958, on a 20-acre tract site of the old Springdale Park, on Allentown Rd. in Yardville, next to St Vincent DePaul Church; it featured an Olympic size swimming pool, sports, arts and crafts, and acres of woods. The Day camp was an immediate success, with a daily attendance of 300 grammar school age girls and boys in that first Summer of '58 and a daily attendance of 500 in the Summer of '59. The Day Camp still flourishes to this day.

With an ever-increasing number of young people participating, the facility at Centre Street became inadequate. On June 13, 1964, the late Bishop George W. Ahr blessed and opened the present CYO Center at 920 South Broad Street. After all these years, it is still home to thousands of youth and adults who participate in the variety of programs and activities sponsored by the Mercer County CYO.

Today it's hard to imagine that the building was originally the RKO Broad Theater. After extensive renovations, the auditorium and stage were transformed into a gymnasium featuring a regulation size basketball court and bleachers. The balcony became game and meeting rooms, and the backstage changed into exercise and locker rooms. Second floor backstage dressing rooms reappeared as the arts and crafts area.

No account of the CYO of Mercer County would be complete without acknowledging the assistance and interest of the Diocese of Trenton and the dedication and work of the late Monsignor Michael P. McCorristin. Monsignor, with a group of volunteers, undertook the renovations at 1 Centre Street and 920 South Broad Street, as well as building the swimming pool and facilities at the Day Camp.

Likewise, the CYO will always be grateful to the legions of men and women, priests and religious educators who in the past as well as in the present, so generously volunteer their time and talents serving the youth of CYO in its long history, here in Mercer County and throughout the Diocese of Trenton.

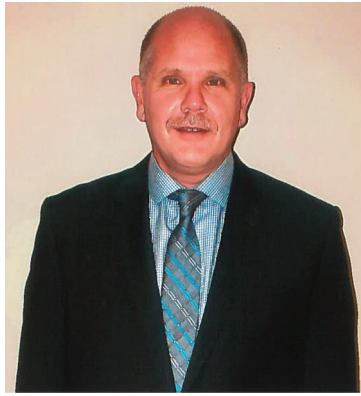

RALPH CHIARELLO
ST. JOACHIM'S

Ralph was a star for the St. Joachim's Crusaders in the late 70's, playing under Hall of Fame Coach, Vince Radice. Chiarello led the Crusaders to the school's first Championship during the 1978 season with a 17-0 record, along the way Ralph was named CYO MVP! In addition, Chiarello was named St. Anthony's Sending School Tournament and Lower Bucks County CYO Invitational Tournament MVP, and was the leading scorer for the 1978 CYO season and All Star Game.

Ralph's basketball success continued at McCorristin where he was one of the leading scorers for a 27-3 Iron Mikes team and led them to their first basketball State Championship in 1982. Ralph has given back to the community as a volunteer basketball coach with Hamilton PAL, Cook AA, Hamilton Little Lads, and the CYO. He has also served as chairperson for 4 years on the St. Gregory the Great Academy School Board.

Chiarello is a graduate of Mercer County Community College and attended Trenton State College. He resides in Hamilton with his wife Debbie and their children Nicholas, Kristyn, and Marissa. Ralph worked for the USPA for 16 years while working full-time at his family business, Chiarello's Deli and Catering in Hamilton, and now he is co-owner of the business. Chiarello's Deli and Catering has been recognized multiple times as Trentonian's People's Choice Award for the best Deli, Hoagies, and Catering.



LOU DEMILLE
BLESSED SACRAMENT, ST. ANTHONY'S,
ST. MARY'S - BORDENTOWN

Lou DeMille has been involved with the CYO as a player and coach for over five decades! His playing career began under legendary and Hall of Fame Coach, Judge David Schroth, from 1967-1969. Lou joins his wife Ann, as a member of the CYO Basketball Hall of Fame, making them the first husband and wife to be inducted, and has coached two Hall of Fame members in Erin Walton and Colleen Flynn Pirmann!

It's DeMille's coaching longevity and success that has gained him entrance in the CYO Basketball Hall of Fame. Lou has touched the lives of many youth on the many teams that he has coached over the years with Blessed Sacrament (boys and girls), St. Anthony's girls, and St. Mary's Bordentown girls. DeMille has won multiple Championships with the Blessed Sacrament squads, and St. Mary's teams, including a 19-0 season in 1998-1999!

Lou played basketball at Cathedral and Pennington schools before heading to Georgetown University where he received a B.S in Foreign Service and then to Seton Hall Law School where he received his Juris Doctorate. Lou is Managing Attorney with Zirulnik, Sherlock, and DeMille. He resides in Bordentown with his wife Ann, and their five boys, Mike, Matt, Kevin, CJ, and Nick.



FRED DUMONT REFEREE

Fred B. Dumont is a 43 year member of IAABO Board # 193 and his long and illustrious officiating career got started at the CYO! Dumont was a regular at the CYO gyms before he worked his way up the Board 193 ranks and beyond, but even as a top State official and administrator, and even today, Fred never forgot where he came from.

Dumont passed the IAABO exam in 1974, and in 1982 he was elected to Board 193's Executive Committee where he served 3 consecutive terms, a total of nine years. In 1991, Fred was elected President of Board #193, a position he held for 20 consecutive years. During this time, he served as a delegate to NJ State Board # 1. Fred served as President to Board # 1 on four different occasions.

In 2006, the NJSIAA named Fred the Boys Basketball Official of the Year. In 2007, Board # 193 presented Dumont with the Joe Logue Award and in 2010, the Colonial Valley Conference named Fred their first Basketball Official of the Year award. He was named the CVC Official of the Year again in 2018; the only official presented this award on two occasions.

Fred has officiated in the NJSIAA Tournament for 36 years. During this time, he officiated 31 times in championship rounds. Fred has also officiated in the Mercer County Tournament since its inception 29 years ago, and has officiated the Championship game on 19 occasions.

Dumont retired as the Business Manager for Insulators Local Union # 89 in July, and currently serves as Labor Liaison for NJ Senate President, Steve Sweeney.

Fred lives in Hamilton with his wife Robynn. He has a daughter Candice & her husband, Mike, son Fred & his wife, Alisha, and son Joseph. Fred is the proud grandfather of Declan, Ascher, Finn, and Carter Osmond & Fred, Dean, and Dominic Dumont. Fred takes pride in his stepson Chris Filippone & his wife Allison, and their daughters Julia and Anna and stepdaughter Cheryl Filippone.



HERMAN ENGLISH REFEREE

Herman English, affectionately known as “Buster”, was a true gentleman and friend to the CYO. He was also an excellent basketball official, and a loving husband, and father. For close to a decade, starting in the mid 90’s Herman was a regular referee for the CYO Grammar School Basketball league. He spent many Friday nights, Saturdays and Sundays officiating games. It was only until Herman began to climb his way up the IAABO Board 193 ranks to more high school and college games did his time on the CYO courts slow down. Even then his presence remained, because he loved the CYO! In addition to the CYO Grammar School league, Herman was also a long time referee for the CYO Teen Program where he not only called the games but mentored the Trenton teenagers that participated. In addition to refereeing basketball, Herman spent many years coaching his son Mark, in Trenton PAL basketball.

In 2013, Herman and his wife Constance were taken too soon in a tragic car accident. They left behind four children; Tamika, Darren, and Mark English, and Marcus Foster; and one granddaughter, Alyse Davis. Herman and Constance were members of ‘I Am Kenny J’ Dance Group; traveling locally and around the country to compete in dance competitions. Wherever he and his wife danced, they captured the attention of all in attendance and dominated the dance floor. Herman had that effect as an official as well on the courts.

English was a graduate of Hamilton High West and attended Mercer County Community College and Rider University. He was employed with the State of NJ since 1975 and most recently with Human Services as a Software Development Specialist 3. English was also owner of E&F Associates Tax Service, where he had many of the same clients for decades. Herman will continue to be missed by the CYO basketball organization as he has made a true impact during the time he was affiliated and beyond!

Rashawn Glenn was a superstar in the CYO league from 1985-1988, winning Championships with Our Lady of Divine Shephard in 1986 and St. Mary's Cathedral in 1988, on a perfect 34-0 team! Glenn was coached at Cathedral by Hall of Famer, Jim Dill, and was the 1988 Playoff MVP, and the regular season Co-MVP along with teammate, Deon Hames, on that magical unbeaten team!

Glenn continued his basketball career at The Hun School from 1988-1992 where he was a three time first team all NJ Prep selection, and led Hun to the 1992 State Championship! Rashawn is the third all time leading scorer in Mercer County High School Basketball history, with 1,935 points. His career continued at Lehigh University, and was named the 1993 Patriot League Rookie of the Year, a two time All Patriot League Player. Rashawn has been inducted into the Lehigh University Hall of Fame, in large part due to being a three time Lehigh basketball MVP and ranks in the top five in all time scoring.

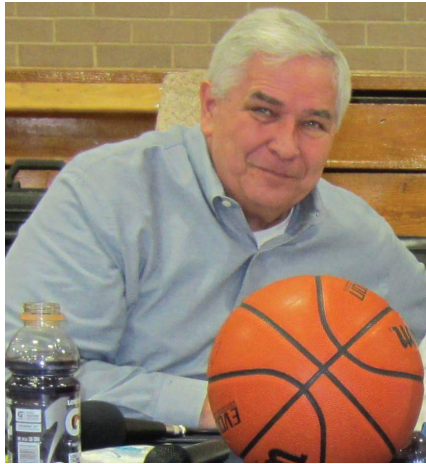

He was married to the late Patricia Haggerty for 54 years and had five children, Kevin, Beth, Colleen, Jim and Patrick. He was a well-loved, decent man with a unique ability to connect to people of all ages, and tell a great story – many about coaching CYO basketball.



JOE HEJDA
SPECIAL CONTRIBUTOR

Joe Hejda, also known as “The Voice of the CYO”, is being inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame as a Special Contributor. It’s Joe’s 22 years of announcing that has earned him this honor. Hejda started with just working OLS home games, but it wasn’t long before his talent was noticed and he was everywhere. Joe was working CYO games at most gyms and was a regular for home games at St. Raphael’s, St. Greg’s, TCA, OLS and Notre Dame for St. Paul’s home games, as well as CYO Championships and All Star Games. Some days Joe would work all day, for the entire slate of a team’s home games, and the first one was just as important and well done as the last. Hejda made a regular season game an event, and he did it for the love of the game, the CYO and the participants when he made them feel like superstars!

Joe’s work as an announcer stretched beyond the CYO as he worked for Princeton, Notre Dame, TCA, and Lawrenceville Prep High Schools (basketball, football, lacrosse, hockey), Cheerleading tournaments, HGSA Softball and many other sporting events. Hejda was the first announcer to call a game at Met Life Stadium when he was asked to work a High School Lacrosse Tournament for Lawrenceville Prep. Joe was also the voice of St. Greg’s Carnival for over 30 years and his nickname of “The Voice of the CYO” stretched to “The Voice of Mercer County.”

Joe passed away quickly in July after a courageous battle with cancer. He is survived by his wife Joanne, and children Lindsay and Jonathan.

Steve continued his basketball career at St. Anthony's High where he was a two time First Team All County selection, two time Team MVP, and a 1,000 point scorer, all of which earned him a full athletic scholarship to St. Joseph's College in Philadelphia. MacZinko played for the Hawks for four years, was a member of two NCAA Tournament Teams, and Team Captain during the 1974-1975 season. Steve graduated from St. Joe's with a B.S. in Marketing and Management.
